### **CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY**

**1. Scope.** The following statement of policy applies to the members of the Board of Directors for the Interfaith Human Services of Putnam (IHSP), and is intended to provide guidance to its members.

**2. Fiduciary Responsibilities.** Members of the Board serve the organization as a whole and have a clear obligation to fulfill their responsibilities in a manner consistent with this fact. IHSP's integrity must be protected and advanced at all times.

Men and women of prominence inevitably are involved in the affairs of other institutions and organizations. An effective Board cannot consist of individuals entirely free from at least perceived conflicts of interest. Although most such potential conflicts are and will be deemed to be inconsequential, all members have the responsibility to ensure that the Board is made aware of situations that involve personal, familial or business relationships that could be troublesome for the organization. Thus the Board requires each Board member annually (a) to review this policy; (b) to disclose any possible personal, familial or business relationships that reasonably could give rise to a perceived or actual conflict involving IHSP; and (c) to acknowledge by his or her signature that he or she is acting in accordance with the letter and spirit of this policy.

**3. Disclosure.** All IHSP Board members are requested to list on an annually distributed disclosure form those relationships that he or she maintains (or members of their family maintains) with organizations that do business with the organization or otherwise could be construed to potentially affect their independent, unbiased judgment in light of his or her decision-making authority or responsibility. In the event a member is uncertain as to the appropriateness of listing a particular relationship, the president of the Board should be consulted. He/she, in turn, may elect to consult with legal counsel, the Executive Committee or the remainder of the Board in executive session. Such information, including information provided on the form, shall be held in confidence except when, after consultation with the members, the best interests of IHSP would be served by disclosure.

**4. Prohibited Transactions/Approvals.** Interests of members include all direct and indirect interests of that person and all direct and indirect interests of any close relative of that person. Prohibitions extend to activities performed indirectly through another person.

**A.** As a general rule, a Board member should not have a financial interest in any transaction with the IHSP or between the IHSP and a third party which might adversely affect the exercise of his or her judgment on behalf of the organization or tend to impair confidence in the IHSP.

**B.** In that regard, no Board member shall (i) have a business relationship with the IHSP or (ii) have any material relationship as director, principal officer, partner or similar relationship with, or have any substantial financial interest in, any party doing business with the IHSP, unless:

(1) In the case of ordinary course of business transactions or relationships involving the IHSP, the IHSP shall grant approval as part of its annual review of conflicts of interest, which approval may be on an after-the-fact basis; or

(2) In all other cases, the Executive Committee shall have granted specific approval before the transaction is consummated or the relationship is established.

All deliberations and actions by the organization under this subsection 4(B) shall be carried out (i) with due deliberation after full disclosure to the Board of all relevant facts and (ii) in compliance with Section 33-1127 to 1130, inclusive, of the Connecticut Nonstock Corporation act, or any comparable successor statute applicable to the IHSP.

**C.** Each Board member shall avoid interests of any kind which might in fact or in appearance divert him or her from continued loyalty to the organization in the performance of services for the organization.

**D.** Each Board member shall avoid receipt of benefits, favors, gifts or entertainment which might adversely affect the exercise of his or her judgment on behalf of the organization or might create an appearance of impropriety.

**5. Restraint on Participation.** A Board member who has declared or been found to have an actual or potential conflict of interest shall refrain from participating in consideration of, or voting upon, a proposed transaction involving that actual or potential conflict, unless for special reasons the Board or Executive Committee requests information or interpretation. In its discretion, the Board may determine whether an Affected Person may be present at a meeting when such a matter is considered.
